

Malaysia: Custom Borneo and Peninsular BWC Tour

Tour Summary

This was quite a special tour for many reason but specifically for me it represented my first time to Asia, my 6th continent (just Antarctica to go!) and a vast array of new wildlife, bird families (and of course species) and many new adventures to experience. So just how did it play out? This was a custom tour so a lovely couple of nature enthusiasts and I spent 17-days working through their itinerary which took us around the state of Sabah on Malaysian Borneo and then to two locations on Peninsular Malaysia, Fraser's Hill and Bukit Tinggi. This tour aimed to experience wildlife, both common and rare and was not designed or run to get the highest list count, even though we wound up with what I think is a pretty impressive list (details at the end of this report).

The first section of this tour took place in the cool mountainous area of Mount Kinabalu. Here the forests are dark and dense and typically cloudy afternoons with cool crisp mornings was a wonderful way to start the journey. Here we ended up nailing 4/5 big targets for the area which include Whitehead's Trogon and the odd Fruit-Hunter. The mountain road was good to us and gave us a great start as we headed on towards our next destination, Sepilok.

What a change from Mount Kinabalu. The heat hit us like a tidal wave but even so we pushed through and enjoyed several walks around our lodging and the famed Rainforest Discovery Center. Here we were treated to one of the biggest targets of the tour, the iconic Orangutan. Happily we experienced THREE sightings each with a pair of these amazing Great Apes. After enduring a great storm on a what later became nick-named "The Tower of Terror" the canopy walk proved incredibly fruitful giving us views at numerous woodpeckers like Banded and White-bellied, a handful of stunning Malkohas and more spunky little passerines. However, I think the highlight from this destination is the bird that graces the cover, the striking Black-crowned Pitta. After all of this walking around, we all agreed it was time for some more relaxed, laid back birding...luckily, Sukau was next up on the docket.

Based in a Nat Geo "Unique Lodges of the World", Sukau Rainforest Lodge, we took morning, afternoon and evening boat rides to find a plethora of birds including every single possible hornbill, even the sensitive Helmeted Hornbill made a fantastic experience. Nice lodge, easy birding and a lovely setting made this one of the more relaxing parts of this tour. Next up, one of the hardest (in my opinion), Danum Valley.

After a long 4x4 transfer to the absolutely stunning Borneo Rainforest Lodge, we got to work. Walking the main road and several leech infested (yes literally) trails we found bundles of babblers, broadbills and bulbuls among some of the more stunning species like Blue-crowned Pitta. Overall, this was the hottest portion of the trip and the most irritable due to the bugs, constant threat of leeches and just the overall difficult nature of the birding but the lodging was



so lovely that frankly I think we were all a bit sad to be leaving here so soon. The silver lining was that we were heading to cooler weather in the hills north of Kuala Lumpur.

Before I continue it is important for me to note that I did not guide this tour on my own. We had three local guides, Adrian (Mount Kinabalu), Jonathan (Sepilok and Sukau) and Ali (Danum Valley) and they were all fantastic and earned our thanks for all they did. No matter which TB guide runs this tour, we always use a local guide to give our guests the best possible experience. That being said, I personally did a lot of studying and helped during those sections but when it came time to do Fraser's Hill and Bukit Tinggi, I was on my own so when we landed, it was time to see what I had learned. The recon trip I had done before the tour paid dividends as the places I loved and had lots of success on during the recon proved yet again to be fruitful, helping us nail birds like Long-tailed Broadbill, the adorable Pygmy Cupwing and Red-headed Trogon.

After our time on the hill, we took a risk and left super early in the morning to try and get to Bukit Tinggi right as the gate opened. This is about 2hrs and 15min away on winding, slippery roads so after some careful driving we arrived just 7-minutes after they opened and went straight for our target bird. Unfortunately, luck just wasn't on our side. The Mountain Peacock Pheasant had already fed for the morning and two gentleman who were staying at the lodge nearby (that gives them early access) said we missed it by maybe 20-minutes. A bummer but a bit of comfort knowing that even if we had arrived right when the gate opened we still wouldn't have seen it. We did however see some amazing birds like Red-bearded Bee-eater, Red-billed Malkoha and Orange-breasted Trogon. Most of all, this was just a great way to end the tour. A nice cool location, a fun lunch in the Medieval French style village at Colmar Tropical and an easy hour and a half transfer back to everyone's favorite hotel, Sama-Sama.

Overall in my mind this trip was a huge success. Again, I want to thank our amazing local guides and the guests for this trip. It was very special and I hope to return some day to see even more of what this unique and friendly country has to offer. What follows in this report is a general summary of each day (or general area if we did repetitive activities), loads of photos all from the tour (and some from the pre-tour), an annotated checklist and a few favorite photos from the guests. *Note: Because this was my first time in Asia and on this tour, I took advantage of every minute of rest time requested by the guests to do some more birding on my own. Because of that, this tour has a higher than usual "Guide-Only" count. Please note the final checklist at the end for more details on all of the birds that were seen on this tour.



Day-to-Day Summary

August 21st: Arrival in Kuala Lumpur

Guests arrived at their leisure on this day.

August 22nd: Kuala Lumpur to Kota Kinabalu

Because our flight was a bit later in the morning and we didn't land until late in the afternoon. We had a simple transfer day, got settled into our hotel and then prepped for our tour to start the next morning. It is important to note we had a stunning Asian Glossy Starling sit nicely in a palm tree for us just before we entered the parking lot where our driver was waiting to take us to the hotel. Close enough to see that stunning red eye without bins and this was our best look on the whole tour!

August 23rd: Kota Kinabalu to Mount Kinabalu via Crocker Range

After a nice breakfast in the hotel, we met up with our guide Adrian and hit the road towards our first region, the Crocker Range. After about 2hrs or so, we started some birding, first checking out the Rafflesia Information Center. We didn't find any flowers here but we did get some great views of Bornean Bulbul and Mountain Barbet.

Just as we were about to leave, we were able to have some quick perched and then a relatively mediocre view of a Bornean Barbet in flight. Two Bornean endemics before lunch...nice! After a nice lunch surrounded by a colony of Plume-toed Swift, we continued with some birding along the main road. Here we picked up some cool birds like; Golden-bellied Gerygone, Gray-chinned Minivet, Bar-winged Shrike-Flycatcher, Yellow-breasted Warbler, Penan Bulbul and our first of many Chestnut-crested Yuhina. Next up was a special stop in what seemed like someone's backyard for a blooming Rafflesia Flower. Luckily we were in the area just one-day after it bloomed which meant it was still looking really good as apparently they only last maybe 4-5 days! That was very cool and we didn't stop there. We continued with the plant theme and drove up a small mountain track to see some very cool Pitcher Plants. While our guide was educating us on the plants, I spotted some suspicious movements in the trees nearby and quickly discovered we had a great little mixed flock moving through. Among them, more bornean endemics, the Bornean Leafbird and Bornean Treepie. Now in Mount Kinabalu National Park we spent the last few hours birding the main road. We spotted Ashy Drongo, White-throated Fantail, Brown Barbet, Golden-naped Barbet, Chestnut-hooded Laughing-Thrush, Temminck's Sunbird and Black-sided Flowerpecker. A nice day for sure.

August 24th - 26th (morning): Mount Kinabalu

We had two full days (the 24th and 25th) of birding the main road and several select trails in Mount Kinabalu. The general pattern of our days was to wake up early, go birding, come back for breakfast, go back out until lunch, have lunch, take a few hour break, go out before dinner, have dinner, go to bed, then repeat. The morning of the 26th we did some birding early and then after breakfast we packed up our bags and transferred back to Kota Kinabalu for our flight to Sandakan. Overall our time in Mount Kinabalu National Park was extremely productive but we were constantly dodging fog and rain. For the most part we were successful and in between



waves of birds we were entertained by the numerous locals and tourists prepping themselves for the hike up to the summit. I think I can speak for all of us when I say we were most impressed with the porters. WOW...these guys...amazing strength and kindness. Over our time in Mount Kinabalu we managed to see 4/5 top 5 target birds, just missing out on Whitehead's Spiderhunter and on that note, we saw 2/3 of the "whitehead's trio". Whitehead's Pygmy Squirrel, Kinabalu, Giant, Black-banded, Bornean Ground and Jentick's Squirrels kept us entertained when the birding was slow, which really wasn't that often. During our stint in this region, highlight birds included; Bornean Stubtail, Whitehead's Trogon and Broadbill, Everett's and Orange-headed Thrush, Red-breasted Partridge, Crimson-headed Partridge (with chicks!), Bornean Swiftlet, Maroon Woodpecker. Sunda and Bare-crowned Laughingthrush, Bornean Forktail, Bornean Whistler, Black-and-Crimson Oriole, Hair-crested Drongo, Bornean Whistling Thrush, Flavescent Bulbul, Mountain Tailorbird, Bornean Green Magpie, Gray-throated Babbler, Temminck's Babbler, Mountain Wren-Babbler, Fruit-Hunter, Ferruginous Flycatcher, Eyebrowed Jungle Flycatcher, Snowy-browed, Little Pied and Indigo Flycatchers. You see how much is around...?!?! This is a really cool place!

The afternoon of the 26th was spent driving back to Kota Kinabalu. Once we arrived at our hotel, we said goodbye to our brilliant local guide Adrian, had a lovely dinner and then tucked into bed for the evening.

August 27th: Kota Kinabalu to Sepilok (Rainforest Discovery Center) via Sandakan

After an easy going morning flight, we landed in Sandakan and met with our new local guide, Jonathan. We'd spend the next several days with him exploring our first lowland forest habitat and what promises to be a more primate filled portion of the trip. After a quick check in at our accommodation for the next two nights, we took a quick walk around MY Resort which introduced us quickly to the heat and humidity we'd be facing for the next 10-days or so. We saw Little Green Pigeon, Black-winged Shrike-Flycatcher, Red-eyed and Cream-vented Bulbul, Brown-throated and Crimson Sunbird, Lesser Green Leafbird and numerous Prevost's Squirrels.

After a quick rest, we ventured out with Jonathan for our first excursion in the iconic Rainforest Discovery Center. Here we were inundated with bulbuls courtesy of a fruiting fig tree. We added Charlotte's Bulbul and Yellow-vented Bulbul to our list as well as the stunning Blue-eared Barbet which I had noticed entered a nest category. Very cool to see this bird so well! Now in the canopy, we added; Red-throated Sunbird, Scarlet-backed Flowerpecker, Black-naped Monarch, Green Iora, Streaked and Spectacled Bulbul, Brown Barbet, Plain Flowerpecker, Plain Sunbird, Common Hill Myna and we got to spend time with a fledging Wallace's Hawk Eagle at eye level...so sweet! Things then turned interesting when on one of the canopy towers we got stuck in an absolutely epic storm. Heavy rains, lighting, thunder and incredible winds got this tower nicknamed "Tower of Terror" but what was even more impressive was watching the young hawk-eagle manage this weather...truly a testament to their resilience. We also got our first really good looks at Pig-tailed Macaque. As soon as we caught a small break in the weather, we made a dash to the car. The rain persisted throughout the afternoon so we met up for dinner and then caught an early night for our full day in the discovery center the next day.


August 28th and 29th (morning): Rainforest Discovery Center

The morning and afternoon of the 28th and the morning of the 29th were spent wandering around the various trails, paths and canopy walks of the Rainforest Discovery Center. We took it slow and saw some great birds and fantastic mammals, chiefly among which, our first views of the stunning and iconic Orangutan. Bird wise we saw some incredible species like; Black-crowned Pitta, White-bellied, Gray-and-Buff, Buff-necked, Buff-rumped, Banded and Crimson-winged Woodpeckers, Raffle's and Chestnut-breasted Malkoha, Changeable Hawk-Eagle, Black Magpie, Crimson Sunbird, Red-naped and Diard's Trogon, Greater Racket-tailed Drongo, Little, Spectacled, Long-billed and Yellow-eared Spiderhunters, White-bellied Erpornis, Black Hornbill, Rufous-collared Kingfisher, Black-capped and Gray-hooded Babbler, Rufous-winged Philentoma, Blue-throated Bee-eater, Pacific Swallow, Zebra Dove, Olive-backed Sunbird and a few fun "other animals" like Common Flying Lizard and Red Giant Flying Squirrel.

Mid-morning on the 29th we began our journey towards Sukau. This is quite a fun little adventure as the only access to this lodge is via water so after a nice lunch, we hopped on our transfer boat and began our 2hr journey towards the lodge. The boat is loud, packed with people and moves fast so communicating sightings was difficult. We did see our first and only Saltwater Crocodile, the first of many Proboscis Monkeys and several "guide-only" sightings including Great Crested Tern and Great Slaty Woodpecker. Once we arrived at our lodge, we had a quick rest and then a quick "into boat tour" before dinner. We also had our first of three evening cruises. More details on what we were able to see on our river cruises are in the following paragraphs.



August 29th (afternoon) - 31st: Sukau River Cruises

During our stay at Sukau Rainforest Lodge, we spent the mornings, afternoons and evenings out on the main river, several small tributaries and one oxbow lake to see all we could see. Among the already named animals we also added Silvered Langur, Bornean Pygmy Squirrel, Whiskered Myotis and Long-tailed Macaque, several species of small snakes including a Reticulated Python and some cute little frogs to help bolster our list. Bird wise we did exceedingly well, sighting birds like; Straw-headed Bulbul, Sooty-capped and White-breasted Babbler, Blue-eared and Stork-billed Kingfisher, Bat Hawk, Crested-serpent Eagle, Jerdon's Baza, Besra, White-nest Swiftlet, Little Fish Eagle, Brahminy Kite, White-breasted Waterhen, Dollarbird, Green Imperial Pigeon, Purple Heron, Intermediate Egret, Storm's Stork, Oriental Darter, Common Sandpiper, Hooded Pitta, Rufous-tailed and Ashy Tailorbird, Bushy-crested, Wreathed, Wrinkled, Helmeted, White-crowned, Black, Rhinoceros, and Oriental Pied Hornbills, Yellow-vented Flowerpecker, Malaysian Blue Flycatcher, Black-and-red Broadbill, Yellow-bellied and Rufescent Prinia, Large Frogmouth, Malaysian Pied Fantail, and the local and incredibly tame Buffy Fish Owl.


September 1st: Sukau to Danum Valley

The morning of the 1st was dedicated to travel. From about 8am until about 12:30pm we were traveling by both boat and 4x4 to reach our final destination on Borneo, Borneo Rainforest Lodge in Danum Valley. After a lovely lunch at the lodge, we checked in to our fantastic rooms, met our guide Ali and then went out for some afternoon birding. Danum valley is tough. Hot, leech infested trails, difficult birding and dense jungle made this area difficult but lots of fun.



September 1st (afternoon), 2nd & 3rd: Danum Valley

We had two full days with Ali to explore the local trails, main road and their canopy walk. Over these few days we saw lots of cool stuff and we started off with another great Orangutan sighting as well as adding Maroon Langur. Other animals came mostly at night and included highlights like; Philippine Slow Loris, Angle-headed Lizard, Bornean Colugo, Rough-necked and Water Monitor Lizards, two species of Latern Bug, Palm Island Civet and Thomas's Flying Squirrel.

Bird wise we added; Bornean Bristlehead, Banded Broadbill, Scarlet-rumped Trogon, Great Argus, Fluffy-backed Tit Babbler, Black-throated Wren Babbler, Blue-crowned Pitta, Bornean Spiderhunter, Bornean Blue Flycatcher, Rufous-backed Dwarf Kingfisher, White-crowned Forktail, Bornean Crested Fireback, Whiskered Treeswift, Brown-backed and Silver-rumped Needletail, House Swift, Rufous Woodpecker, Cream-eyed Bulbul, Striped Wren Babbler, Yellow-bellied Bulbul, Brown Wood Owl, Rufous-tailed Shama, Barred Eagle Owl, White-fronted Falconet, Hairy-backed Bulbul, Blythe's Paradise Flycatcher, Gray-headed Canary Flycatcher, Yellow-breasted and Orange-bellied Flowerpecker and Bold-striped Tit Babbler.



September 4th: Danum to Kuala Lumpur

This day was entirely travel. We opted not to do any birding in the morning in order to avoid sweating too much before all of our airplane travel. After the 3hr 4x4 journey back to civilization, we began our travel by air. First up was our flight to Kota Kinabalu and then after a small layover, back to Kuala Lumpur. We checked into our old friend the Sama-Sama, had a good nights rest and prepped ourselves for the last leg of our tour, the Fraser's Hill area.



September 5th: The Gap and Fraser's Hill

This is an easy going morning as we need to wait for the store that sells grain and mealworms to open in downtown Kuala Lumpur. So after a nice breakfast, and a quick drive into town we hit the road towards Fraser's Hill. This is a slow, twisty road up and it was made even slower due to a torrential down-pour. It stopped for a few moments right when we arrived at "The Gap" so we birded around just a bit but the weather was still pretty tough and the birds weren't overly active. We did manage; Black-crested Bulbul, Verditier Flycatcher, Bronzed Drongo, Oriental Magpie Robin, Silver-rumped Needletail, and Large-billed Crow. Overall the weather kept the bird activity low so after "the Gap" we made our way slowly up the mountain, trying to listen for and spot some bird activity. We ran into one crazy flock which had a lot of new birds for us, things like: Blue-winged Leafbird, Lesser Racket-tailed Drongo, Chestnut-capped Laughingthrush, Chestnut-crowned Warbler, Yellow-bellied Warbler, Streaked Spiderhunter, Black-throated Sunbird, Scarlet Minivet, and Bar-winged Shrike-Flycatcher.

September 6th & 7th: Fraser's Hill

Now in Fraser's Hill, we spent the next few days birding the roads. Overall Fraser's Hill was quite bird rich. It was cool, no rain (except at nights) and our accommodations though a bit different than we were expecting were interesting so it made our time in Frasers Hill a great last leg of the tour. Highlights from our bird list in Fraser's Hill were; Black-browed, Fire-tufted, and Red-throated Barbet, Long-tailed Sibia, Large Niltava, Orange-bellied Leafbird, Red-headed Trogon, Velvet-fronted Nuthatch, Pygmy Cupwing, Sultan Tit, Orange-backed Woodpecker, Black-thighed Falconet, Malayan Partridge, Green-billed Malkoha, Black Eagle, Oriental Honey



Buzzard, Rufous-bellied Eagle, Lesser and Greater Yellownape. Common Green Magpie, Rufous-bellied Swallow, Malayan Laughingthrush, Fiery Minivet, Chestnut-tailed and Bluewinged Minla, and Rufous-browed Flycatcher. We did see a few new mammals including Himalayan Striped Squirrel, Dusky Leaf Monkey and a fantastic encounter with a group of Bearded Pig.

September 8th: Fraser's Hill to Kuala Lumpur via Bukit Tinggi


The original plan for this day was to bird Fraser's Hill in the morning, and then head back to Kuala Lumpur. However, early on in the trip, one of the guests mentioned they'd like to try for a bird located about 2.5hrs away. This bird needs to be visited early but there's a catch...the entrance gate. If you stay in the area, you stay within the boundary of the gate and thus can enter the area at any time. I you don't however (as was our situation) you are a bit handcuffed. After explaining all of this, the guests still wanted to give it a try so we left nice and early and after 2.5hrs arrived at the gate of Bukit Tinggi just minutes after it opened. We high-tailed it up to the hide where we hoped to find our special bird. Unfortunately, we had met a few photographers who told us our bird, the Mountain Peacock Pheasant had left about 25min ago...we waited for a



bit, did a few laps of the area, waited some more but unfortunately, it seemed that the bird had had its fill of grain and was taking the rest of the morning off. Too bad but it was definitely worth a try. Even though we missed this species, we did pick up some new ones like; Red-billed Malkoha, Gold-whiskered Barbet, Sooty Barbet, Gray-rumped Treeswift, Germain's Swift, Yellow-crowned Barbet, Stripe-throated Bulbul, Little and Gray-breasted Spiderhunter, Orange-breasted Trogon, Black-and-yellow Broadbill, Asian Emerald Dove, Red-bearded Bee-eater, Sunda Scimitar-Babbler, and Asian Fairy Bluebird.

After a lovely lunch at Colmar Tropicale, a weird medieval French style town and castle, we drove our final 1.5hr stint back towards Sama-Sama, checked into our rooms and wrapped up what I thought was a very successful tour. Until next time Malaysia!


