This was a short trip aimed at taking in some of the top highlights of Southeast Asia, namely diverse and mountainous northwest Thailand and the Angkor Wat area of northwestern Cambodia. It was a delightful trip on many scores. We racked up 389 species of birds. Just a few of many highlights included Hume's Pheasant, Giant Nuthatch, Red-faced Liocichla, Greater and Lesser Adjutants, Sarus Crane, Spotted Wood-Owl and Caspian Plover. We also enjoyed good hotels and fantastic food throughout this trip. Thai and Cambodia cuisines are both different, but both delightful.
