**OVERVIEW:** The following is a short summary of this relaxed Birding With a Camera® custom tour that is meant to complement the **VIDEO VIRTUAL TOUR** that you can watch on YouTube by following this link: <https://youtu.be/xdxo70I8zsl>

This nice custom tour took place in central Costa Rica, and it focused on getting some nice photos and views of some of the most famous birds of this great country. We took advantage of the superb lodges and reserves found all over Costa Rica, where feeders and gardens attract a huge variety of bird, usually in very beautiful landscapes.

This was the itinerary for our trip:

<b>7 March</b>	<b>Donde Cope and drive to Savegre / Night in Savegre Valley</b>
<b>8 March</b>	<b>Savegre Valley, Cerro de la Muerte &amp; Batsu Garden / Night in Savegre Valley</b>
<b>9 March</b>	<b>Feathers Garden and Paraiso Quetzal; travel back to San Jose / Night San Jose</b>
<b>10 March</b>	<b>Day trip to Cinchona and Virgen del Socorro / Night San Jose</b>
<b>11 March</b>	<b>Departure from San Jose</b>

We covered a little bit of the Central Valley, but we mainly focused on two regions, the Caribbean lowlands and foothills for the first three and a half days, while the rest of the tour was spent mainly in the highlands at Cinchona and at Cerro de la Muerte in the Talamanca Mountains. We covered a vast altitudinal range, and new birds came daily in a constant stream.

We recorded many of the most iconic birds of the region along with tons of other species more widely distributed across the Neotropics. I even got one special lifer that I had been chasing for years in various countries, the elusive Central American Pygmy-Owl which was of course my favorite of the trip. However, the voting at the end of the tour came up with the following favorite birds for our participants.

1. Three-wattled Bellbird (this is the only one with an actual podium spot)  
*The other favorites are not in any particular order*
2. Resplendent Quetzal
3. Black-crested Coquette
4. Long-tailed Silky-Flycatcher
5. Violet Sabrewing
6. Flame-throated Warbler
7. Rufous-winged Woodpecker
8. Emerald Tanager
9. White-collared Manakin
10. ALL HUMMINGBIRDS with special mentions for Volcano, Talamaca, and Fiery-throated Hummingbirds

## FINAL CHECKLIST:

A total of **239** species of **BIRDS** were recorded on this tour. Out of this total, 14 were heard only (**H**) and **22** species were seen only by the tour leader (**L**). In terms of **MAMMALS**, we only recorded **8** species; we were a little unlucky with mammals in this trip. See the final list below. (E) indicated a species only found in southern Central America.
