TROPICAL BIRDING TANGE COSTA RICA: Birding with a Camera®

8th - 20th March, 2022

Costa Rica is the ever-popular birding destination for good reason. Excellent lodges are set in prime locations, with amazing birds right at your fingertips. Costa Rica has been doing this for so long, it now comes second nature to them, and they take catering to birders and photographers to the next level. Not only do they have abundant feeder set-ups to bring birds up close and personal, but they are often well thought out to provide excellent photo opportunities. As well as excellent birding throughout, we took advantage of many additional hummingbird feeders, fruit feeders, flowering gardens, staked out fruiting trees, nesting and roosting sites, plus additional night walks and even a dedicated Quetzal viewing tour to maximize our photo opportunities. In doing so we managed to photograph the majority of species seen on this tour and everyone obtained an excellent array of photos.

9th March - Alajuela to Rancho Naturalista

We began our tour with some pre-breakfast birding around the hotel garden. We knocked off quite a few common species straight away, with Squirrel Cuckoo, Lesson's Motmot, Hoffmann's Woodpecker, Cinnamonbellied Saltator, Cinnamon Hummingbird and some rather vocal Rufous-naped Wrens. We tracked down the resident Ferruginous Pygmy-Owl and pair of Spot-breasted Orioles, and had a fly-over of Crimson-fronted Parakeets. On our way to breakfast I heard a Lineated Woodpecker and called it into the tree next to us. Our very experienced driver had recommended an addition to our schedule which was a place called Donde Cope. An enterprising local had set up some great feeders in a lovely natural garden. We enjoyed a good hour and a half photographing a wide variety of species, including Pale-vented Pigeon, White-necked Jacobin, Long-billed & Stripe-throated Hermits, Bronze-tailed Plumeleteer, Crowned Woodnymph, Black-cheeked Woodpecker, Orange-chinned Parakeet, Chestnut-headed & Montezuma Oropendolas, Red-winged Blackbird, Crimsoncollared Tanager, plus Red-legged & Green Honeycreepers. Feeders were not the only attraction at Donde Cope. They also had a few local stakeouts, the first of which was a pair of Crested Owls. After that we were taken to a day roost of a Great Potoo, then we were shown some miniscule White Tent Bats in some forest nearby where we also picked up Yellow-throated & Keel-billed Toucans and a Three-toed Sloth. From there we drove to Rancho Naturalista which would be our base for the next 3 nights.

10 March - Rancho Naturalista

We gathered on the balcony of the lodge to watch the feeders before breakfast. We added Green-breasted Mango on the hummingbird feeder, Black-striped & Orange-billed Sparrows and Yellow-faced Grassquits down below feeding on seed and Crimson-collared Tanager, Brown Jay, many Gray-headed Chachalacas and Silver-throated Tanagers feeding on fruit. A Bicolored Hawk perched high up on a tree scanning for prey while in nearby trees we saw Crested Guan, Black-crowned Tityras and Black-headed Saltator. We took a walk after breakfast. Our main target was the unbelievably bright blue Lovely Cotinga. We headed to a clearing where it had appeared the day before, and on the way there we added a very vocal Brown Violetear, a skulking Bay Wren, some wing-snapping White-collared Manakins and a pair of Gartered Trogons high in the trees. We hung around the clearing for quite a while and pick up plenty of good birds including flyovers of Brown-hooded & White-crowned Parrots, Golden-olive Woodpecker, Cinnamon Becard, Olive-backed Euphonia, Golden-hooded & Bay-headed Tanagers, Scarlet-thighed Dacnis. We thought we heard the cotinga at a point, but it never showed and we had to give up. We headed down to the lower house where there was a wonderful hummingbird garden that held several important target hummers, including Garden Emerald, Green Thorntail & Black-crested Coquette.

Last but not least, Snowcap, which featured on the T-shirts of the lodge. After lunch we set off down the hill for an excursion. On the way down we spotted a Russet-naped Wood-Rail by the side of the road but it quickly disappeared into the creek. We drove to a local reservoir called Angostura Florencia. Along the road, we found a number of interesting birds like Barred Antshrike, Cocoa Woodcreeper, Yellow Tyrannulet, Brown Jay, Black-cowled Oriole, White-browed Gnatcatcher, Yellow-crowned & Yellow-throated Euphonia and White-lined Tanager. We also heard a Thicket Antpitta, but try as we may, we couldn't get the bird to come out of its thicket. Well named, I guess. We found a nice viewpoint of the lake where we added many water birds including Black-bellied Whistling-Duck, Muscovy Duck, Lesser Scaup, Purple Gallinule, Limpkin, Northern Jacana, Great Blue, Little Blue & Green Herons, Osprey, Snail Kite, plus Ringed & Amazon Kingfishers. We continued round the lake and reached a spot on the edge where we added White-throated Flycatcher and Slaty Spinetail. Our time was up and we drove back up to the lodge where we enjoyed another delicious meal.

11 March - Rancho Naturalista

We began the day at dawn by the UV light on a moth sheet that had drawn in Red-throated Ant-Tanager but we also had our first White-ruffed Manakin. After another delicious breakfast we took a walk down the entrance road in the hope of a Lovely Cotinga. Again, we had great activity and saw Keel-billed Toucan, Cocoa Woodcreeper, White-collared Manakin, Cinnamon Becard, Black-headed Tody-Flycatcher, Stripe-breasted Wren, Golden-winged, Chestnut-capped & Golden-crowned Warblers, White-shouldered & Golden-hooded Tanagers, but no cotinga. Some people were good to leave from here for our morning excursion, but others needed to head back to their rooms. I escorted those heading back up and told our driver to bring them back down once they were assembled. Ten minutes later, the bus came back down to the lookout point where the rest of the group were intently looking across at a fruiting tree. The others piled off the bus, just in time to see the Lovely Cotinga still there. It didn't hang around much longer but everybody got on it and we even got some nice photos of this stunning species. We drove down the hill to the forested Río Tuis valley that held a few species we were yet to see. Straight off we saw a soaring Barred Hawk and flock of noisy Sulphur-winged Parakeets flying by.

We spent a couple of hours birding along the road which we found to be quite productive with plenty of nice birds, including Collared Trogon, Olive-striped & Slaty-capped Flycatchers, Scale-crested Pygmy-Tyrant, Tawny-capped Euphonia, Black-and-white, Chestnut-capped & Golden-crowned Warblers, Bay-headed, Emerald & Black-and-yellow Tanagers and a memorable American Dipper. Next, we drove to a Sunbittern nest which was viewable from a small bridge. We got great views of this unusual bird and it seemed totally unperturbed by our snapping shutters. We found our first Torrent Tyrannulet on the river and also Common Tody-Flycatcher and Mistletoe Tyrannulet in the riverside vegetation. We had a short break after lunch before heading out on one of the lodge trails. Our guide showed us our second Crested Owl day roost of the trip. Forest birding is never easy, but we did pretty well and found a number of interesting species. One client in particular was especially happy to see our first Rufous Motmot of the trip, plus White-breasted Wood-Wren, Blue-winged Warbler, Red-throated Ant-Tanager and Carmiol's Tanager. The highlight of the afternoon was a fantastic mixed flock, including Goldenolive Woodpecker, Russet Antshrike, Checker-throated Stipplethroat, Wedge-billed & Spotted Woodcreepers, the amazing Brown-billed Scythebill, plus Sulphur-rumped & Ochre-bellied Flycatchers. We ended the afternoon by heading down to Hummingbird Pools where we watched hummingbirds splash bathing.

12 March – Rancho Naturalista to Savegre Valley


We said our goodbyes to the wonderful staff of Rancho and set off for our next destination. We had a brief stop at Lago de Cachi where we picked up Muscovy Duck, Least Grebe, Green Heron and nearby our first Roadside Hawk. We also swung by the town of Ujarras where one of Costa Rica's few endemic species is to be found. It took us about 10 minutes to find the Cabanis's Ground-Sparrow hopping around in someone's garden. From there we made our way up into the mountains for a whole different set of birds. We did some birding along a side road which turned out to be very productive with our first montane species. We had Band-tailed Pigeon and White-collared Swifts flying over. We also had Mountain Elaenia, Black-capped Flycatcher, Mountain Thrush, Black-and-yellow Silky-flycatcher, and Yellow-thighed Brushfinch. We drove up higher into the mountains and stopped in Los Quetzales NP and the top of the Providencia road where we spent some time. Here we saw Yellow-winged Vireo, Black-billed Nightingale-Thrush, Sooty-capped Chlorospingus and Wilson's Warbler but only heard our target Timberline Wren. We turned down into the Savegre Valley and our last birding spot for the day was at a wonderful place called Miriam's Restaurant. The hummingbird feeders here had Lesser Violetear, Talamanca, Fiery-throated & Volcano Hummingbirds and on the bananas, Acorn Woodpecker, Sooty Thrush, Large-footed Finch, Flame-throated Warbler and Flame-colored Tanager, plus Slaty Flowerpiercer visiting the many beautiful flowers. After we had taken a lot of great photos here, we continued down to Trogon Lodge.

13 March - Paraiso del Quetzal



We met early to bird the ground of the hotel. On my way down to meet the group, my path was blocked by a large group of people looking at Resplendent Quetzal. I squeezed by and ran down to bring up my group to see it. It was such narrow trail it was hard to find a good spot, but we finally all got a view. The garden was otherwise pretty quiet with just a few of the birds that we had seen yesterday like Lesser Violetear, Volcano Hummingbird, Mountain Thrush, Sooty-capped Chlorospingus and Large-footed Finch. We only heard the beautiful call of the Black-faced Solitaire but were unable to locate it, but we did add Collared Redstart. After breakfast we drove to Paraiso Quetzal Lodge. In the morning we had reserved a photographic blind with hummingbird feeders, just for ourselves. Here they put some flowers out for us and sprayed them with sugar water so we could get some nice shots of Lesser Violetear, Talamanca, Fiery-throated & Volcano Hummingbirds plus White-throated Mountaingem at the flowers. On the fruit feeder we had Mountain Thrush, Large-footed Finch, Yellow-thighed Brushfinch, Flame-colored Tanager and Black-thighed Grosbeak. Just outside the blind, there was a fruiting tree which brought in Long-tailed Silky-flycatcher, Golden-browed Chlorophonia, Yellow-bellied Siskin and Peg-billed Finch which we kept having to run out for. We had hundreds of Barred Parakeets flying over, a cute little Ochraceous Wren in a tree and Ruddy-capped Nightingale-Thrush hopping around on the ground.

After a full morning with lots of great photos, we set off with a guide from the lodge to a stake out for **Resplendent Quetzal** in the La Esperanza area. The lodge had partnered with a man who had them on his land. There was a tree where they like to hang out, and they had added a few extra, natural-looking branches for better photos. It was drizzling most of the afternoon, but there was a shelter there with a bathroom and even hot drinks to keep us warm. We had an amazing photo shoot with a pair of quetzals coming by every once in a while and perching out. While we waited, we saw plenty of other good birds, including **Ruddy Treerunner**, **Mountain Elaenia**, **Ruddy-capped Nightingale-Thrush**, **Mountain Thrush**, **Sooty-capped Chlorospingus**, **Wilson's Warbler** and **Slaty Flowerpiercer**. After a great day, we drove back to our lodge for another delicious meal.

14 March – Savegre Valley to Talari Mountain Lodge

We were leaving the Savegre Valley and heading to lower elevations, but first we were going right to the top, to Cerro de la Muerte, the 'Mountain of Death', for some high altitude species. Our main target was the Volcano Junco which we found straight away. We also added Black-cheeked Warbler, Red-tailed Hawk and also had dozens of migrating Broad-winged Hawks. Halfway downslope, we stopped at another spot called Bosque Del Tolomuco. Here they had excellent hummingbird and fruit feeders and we spent a while in the extensive gardens where we added many species and got lots of great photos. On the sugar water feeders we added Violet Sabrewing and Green-crowned Brilliant, and on the verbena flowers White-throated Mountain-gem, Scintillant Hummingbird and White-tailed Emerald. On the fruit feeders we had Red-headed Barbet, Red-crowned Woodpecker, Baltimore Oriole, Tennessee Warbler, Rose-breasted Grosbeak, Summer, Speckled, Goldenhooded & Silver-throated Tanagers. We had a fly-over of Brown-hooded Parrot and in the nearby trees, Browncapped Vireo, Elegant Euphonia and Black-and-white Warbler.

We stopped for lunch in a restaurant with a nice balcony where we saw Broad-winged Hawk, Mistletoe Tyrannulet, Speckled Tanager and Scarlet-thighed Dacnis. After lunch in the town of San Isidro we spent some time searching for Turquoise Cotinga. Despite the heat, we saw plenty of birds, with Double-toothed Kite, Crested Caracara, Streak-headed Woodcreeper, Masked Tityra, Southern Beardless-Tyrannulet, Tropical Mockingbird, Blue Dacnis and Variable & Morelet's Seedeaters. We had almost given up on the Turquoise Cotinga when the driver spotted it. Unfortunately, it flew before everybody got onto it, but we quickly managed to relocate it. It wasn't far to the Talari Mountain Lodge where we had a Lesson's Motmot to welcome us. After check in and a rest, we went out for some afternoon birding. Around the rooms was pretty active and we saw Common Tody-Flycatcher, Dusky-capped, Streaked & Piratic Flycatchers, Orange-billed Sparrow, Goldenhooded Tanager, Blue Dacnis and Red-legged Honeycreeper, many of which were photographed. We walked down to the river overlook where we had Spotted Sandpiper, Black Phoebe, Yellow-headed Caracara, Red-crowned Woodpecker, Variable Seedeater and our best views of Yellow-throated Toucan. We took another walk around after dinner and had Common Pauraque and even Boat-billed Heron the river.

15 March – Los Cusingos & Talari Mountain Lodge


We had a nice early morning walk concentrating mainly around the river viewpoint. Other than our first distant White-tailed Kite, we had good views of Scaled Pigeon, 2 new hummingbird species: Long-billed Starthroat and Scaly-breasted Hummingbird, Red-crowned & Pale-billed Woodpeckers, Crested Caracara, a pair of Whitecrowned Parrots, Rufous-breasted & Riverside Wrens, Rose-breasted Grosbeak, Golden-hooded & Bay-headed Tanagers and Green Honeycreeper. The highlight though was another, and much closer Turquoise Cotinga which was spectacular and perched nicely for a few seconds. From the balcony of the restaurant, we also added our first Snowy-bellied Hummingbird. This morning we were heading to Los Cusingos, the former home of the late Dr Alexander Skutch, one of the pioneers of modern Neotropical ornithology. We made a good start with another new hummingbird species, Blue-throated Goldentail. We had a successful walk along the shortest loop trail and saw Slaty-tailed Trogon, Chestnut-backed Antbird, Brown-billed Scythebill, Red-capped Manakin, Rufous Piha, Masked Tityra, Golden-crowned Spadebill, Dusky-capped Flycatcher and Lesser Greenlet.

Birding wasn't particularly easy, but we were happy with our haul and got a few nice photos. Back in the garden, we added Gray-headed Tanager, Speckled Tanager, Violet-headed Hummingbird, a spectacular Swallow-tailed Kite and a Short-tailed Hawk. We went back to the lodge for lunch and in the afternoon, we took another walk around the lodge gardens. I had located a small ant swarm and took everybody up to see Tawny-winged Woodcreeper and another Gray-headed Tanager. Some of the other nice birds in the afternoon included Orange-collared Manakin, Streaked Flycatcher, Rufous-breasted Wren, Ovenbird and Blue Dacnis, but the birding highlight of the afternoon was the incredible spectacle of a couple of thousand Swainson's Hawk streaming by and circling. We finished the walk looking over the river again, where we saw Black Phoebe, Amazon Kingfisher, Variable Seedeater and Peregrine Falcon swooping by. To finish it off, we had great views of a Neotropical River Otter. If that wasn't enough, we also had a Tropical Screech-Owl on the way to dinner.

16 March – Talari Mountain Lodge to Esquinas Rainforest Lodge

It was our last birding around Talari Mountain Lodge and we went out with a blast. We had a bumper crop of birds including, Scaled & Band-tailed Pigeons, Chestnut-collared & White-collared Swifts, Scaly-breasted & Snowybellied Hummingbirds, Amazon Kingfisher, Yellow-throated Toucan, Smoky-brown & Pale-billed Woodpeckers, White-crowned Parrot, Orange-collared Manakin, Southern Beardless & Mistletoe Tyrannulets, Yellowthroated, Philadelphia & Red-eyed Vireos Rufous-breasted Wren, Chestnut-capped Warblers, Rose-breasted Grosbeak, Speckled, Golden-hooded & Bay-headed Tanagers, Red-legged & Green Honeycreepers and Buffthroated Saltator. We had a pretty long drive today but broke it up with a stop at the San Isidro sewage lagoons, where we saw Black-bellied Whistling-Duck, Blue-winged Teal, Least & Pied-billed Grebes, Northern Jacana, Spotted & Solitary Sandpipers, Green Heron and Mangrove Swallow. A bit later we also had a quick stop for much better views of Swallow-tailed Kite. After a nice lunch stop, we continued on to Esquinas Rainforest Lodge and enjoyed some fantastic birding along the entrance road. In a marshy area we saw Purple Gallinule, Northern Jacana, Wood Stork, Little Blue & Green Herons and White Ibis; and in the open areas, Orange-chinned & Brown-throated Parakeets, Streaked & Fork-tailed Flycatchers, Eastern & Red-breasted Meadowlarks, Bronzed Cowbird, Ruddy-breasted, Variable & Yellow-bellied Seedeaters and Thick-billed Seed-Finch. We even had 2 Blue Ground Doves, why are normally shy, chasing each other around in the middle of a field. We had a warm welcome to the lodge and during our orientation, we had great views of Gray-cowled Wood-Rails and even a **Tayra** coming into the banana feeder. What an amazing place!

17 March - Esquinas Rainforest Lodge

We took a pre-breakfast walk along the entrance road and came across a pair of Slaty-tailed Trogons, a Purplecrowned Fairy and Bronzy Hermit by the Caiman pond, that had a 1ft high fence to keep the Spectacled Caimans in. We went along a short trail along to a small pond here we got close views of Purple Gallinule and Northern Jacana. During breakfast we watched the lawn across from the restaurant and admired the Gray-cowled Wood-Rails again but also a huge pair of Great Curassows. This was a big target for a couple of tour participants. We took a short walk around the gardens and admired Crowned Woodnymph, Violet-headed & Charming Hummingbirds, Black-striped & Orange-billed Sparrows and Gray-chested Dove. Many of the birds that we were missing from our list were forest interior birds. We decided to take a walk along a trail and with some effort we found Band-tailed Barbthroat, Long-billed Hermit, Rufous-tailed Jacamar, Baird's Trogon, Chestnut-backed Antbird, Wedge-billed Woodcreeper and the rare endemic Black-cheeked Ant-Tanager. We enjoyed a nice lunch during which we had a pair of Baird's Trogon inspecting a nest cavity right next to the restaurant. A bit annoying as it had taken us quite a bit of time to find these along the trail. We had a well-deserved break after lunch and in the afternoon took another walk along road and back to the pond. This turned out to be very productive and we picked up Orange-collared Manakin, Black-tailed Flycatcher, Bright-rumped Attila, Spot-crowned Euphonia, Short-billed Pigeon, Dot-winged Antwren and Dusky Antbird. Some people were keen on more frogs and joined a local guide for another night walk after dinner.

18 March – Esquinas Rainforest Lodge to Villa Lapas

It was our final morning here and we tried to make the most of it with some birding before and after breakfast. During the morning we racked up quite a list, with Crested Guan, Great Curassow, Short-billed Pigeon, Graychested Dove, our first Costa Rican Swifts, several hummingbirds at the garden's many flowers, including Bandtailed Barbthroat, Long-billed & Stripe-throated Hermits, and Violet-headed & Charming Hummingbirds, Graycowled Wood-Rail, Baird's & Gartered Trogons, Lineated Woodpecker, Black-hooded Antshrike, Dot-winged Antwren, Wedge-billed Woodcreeper, Orange-collared Manakin, Great Crested, Sulphur-bellied & Piratic Flycatcher, Black-bellied & Riverside Wrens, and Black-striped & Orange-billed Sparrows. After saying our farewells, we did a bit more birding on the way out, with a few other species like White Ibis, Fork-tailed Flycatcher and Morelet's Seedeater. It was a long drive to our next lodge, and we broke it up with a few birding stops. The first was when someone spotted a large white bird soaring, which turned out to be our only King Vulture of the trip. Another stop produced Orange-chinned Parakeet, Boat-billed Flycatcher and Mangrove Swallow. Finally, as we got closer to our destination, we stopped at an ocean viewpoint with Magnificent Frigatebirds flying by, but after waiting around for a while we also had a couple of pairs of Scarlet Macaws flying in. We arrived at our lodge and relaxed in our air-conditioned rooms during the heat of the day. When it had cooled down a bit, we took an afternoon walk around the gardens. Some people who came out early had just seen some Fiery-billed Aracaris flying by. The garden backed onto the river and along the banks we saw Northern Waterthrush, Buff-rumped Warbler, Green Kingfisher and an injured White-whiskered Puffbird. Rufous-naped Wrens were hopping round the garden and Yellow-throated Toucans calling up in the trees. We walked along the river trail and saw Greenish Elaenia, Boat-billed & Streaked Flycatchers, Dot-winged Antwren and a female Bluecrowned Manakin feeding on berries. The highlight though was coming across a Scarlet Macaw nesting tree.

19 March – Tarcoles River to Alajuela

Before breakfast we had some birding around the grounds of Villa Lapas and along the river trail that we had birded yesterday. On some of the gardens beautiful flowering bushes we saw Stripe-throated Hermit and Rufoustailed Hummingbird, and on some fruiting trees, a female Blue-crowned Manakin, Yellow-throated Euphonia, Baltimore Oriole and Red-legged & Green Honeycreepers. Along the trail we also saw Gray Hawk, Hoffmann's Woodpecker, our first Rose-throated Becards, Common Tody-Flycatcher, Bright-rumped Attila and Northern Waterthrush. It's always hard to top the local Scarlet Macaw which we saw flying round to start their day, but we also had a couple of pairs of Mealy Parrots which showed rather well. We had been hoping for a new motmot this morning, but it was not until after breakfast on the way to the river that the driver spotted a Turquoise-browed Motmot on a roadside wire. Our last activity of the trip was a boat ride on the Tarcoles, which promised to finish off our tour with a bang. As you would expect on a boat ride, we had plenty of waterbirds, with Southern Lapwing, Muscovy Duck, Black-necked Stilt, White Ibis, Roseate Spoonbill, Great Blue, Little Blue, Tricolored & Green Herons, Yellow-crowned Night-Heron and a wonderful Bare-throated Tiger-Heron. Not to mention Osprey, Ringed, Belted, Amazon & Green Kingfishers, flocks of Orange-fronted Parakeets flying over and a pair of Mangrove Swallows which were actually nesting on the moving boat. Near the mouth of the estuary we added several shorebirds, with Semipalmated Plover, Whimbrel, Ruddy Turnstone, Sanderling, Willet plus several Magnificent Frigatebirds and Brown Pelicans.

One of the highlights of the boat ride was cruising through the mangroves. Our hoped for Mangrove Hummingbird turned out to be a **Scaly-breasted Hummingbird**, but we did get the specialist **Mangrove Vireo**. Another big target was **Boat-billed Heron** and the boat man found a sleeping individual which we managed to get some pictures of. Some other great birds we saw here were **Anhinga**, **Common Black Hawk**, **Gartered Trogon**, **Lineated Woodpecker** plus the wonderful **American Pygmy Kingfisher**. It had been a real highlight of the trip, but our time was up, and all that remained was to return to Hotel Robledal where we had started the trip and enjoy a final meal while deciding our birds of the trip.
